



## **ICAP voted overall interdealer broker of the year by Risk Magazine**

London, 20 September 2007 – ICAP plc, the world’s premier interdealer broker, has been voted overall interdealer broker of the year in Risk Magazine’s annual rankings published this month. ICAP was placed in the first position in more products (35) than any other broker and scored particularly well in interest rates, where it placed first in 29 categories. ICAP was previously named interdealer broker of the year in the 2006 Risk awards and broker of the year in the 2006 Energy Risk Awards. Earlier this year, ICAP was also named 2007 Carbon Broker of the Year by Point Carbon.
